WWRA NET POLICY

[All organizations wishing to use the WWRA repeater system]

The Western Washington Repeater Association is a non-profit membership owned repeater system and welcomes all amateur radio clubs if they decide they want to utilize the WWRA repeaters for nets. However, net participants are expected to become supporting members of the WWRA. Additionally it is an open repeater for all amateur radio operators to utilize however if operators plan on using it regularly then membership financial support is expected.

NECESSARY SUPPORT: The reason for this is that the WWRA is self-insured and is located on a commercial site and does not have the luxury of conducting volunteer maintenance on all of its equipment. When aloft antennae work needs to be accomplished by either replacing or repairing the WWRA is required to hire professional tower technicians authorized by our host. This requirement coupled with the fact that some of our equipment needs to go back to the factory for repair and calibration causes the WWRA to keep a well maintained fund to respond to these needs.

So, it is with that objective in mind the managers of the WWRA request all users to support the repeaters system with their annual dues. Any club or organization utilizing the repeater system is most welcome but should ensure their membership is aware of this policy. All users, including the volunteers who work on the repeater are dues paying members.

EXEMPTIONS: Canadian stations that are guest in our country are exempt. The traffic passers, special safety nets established to monitor pedestrian or other races, SAR events and any other public service events are more than welcome to avail themselves of the WWRA repeaters and are not expected to support the WWRA.
